Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

When the heresy of Nestorianism reared its head in the 5th century, St Cyril, then Patriarch of Alexandria in Egypt, was called by God to defend the Church's doctrines about the Incarnation of the Son of God. Nestorius was teaching that the Son of God and the man Jesus of Nazareth were two separate persons who formed a "union according to good pleasure." In response, St Cyril pointed to the witness of the New Testament writings. He quoted

the first chapter of John's Gospel speaks of the eternal Word of God who "became flesh and dwelt among us" (). And he often cited the Epistle to the Philippians, which states the following:

"Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus, who, being in the form of God, did not consider it robbery to be equal with God, but made

Himself of no reputation, taking the form of a bondservant, and coming in the likeness of men. And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself and became obedient to the point of death, even the death of the cross. Therefore God also has highly exalted Him and given Him the name which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those in heaven, and of those on earth, and of those under the earth, and that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father."

From the testimony of the Apostles, as confirmed by the Saints, we learn what God has done

for us. He has demonstrated His eternal and selfless love for us by entering into our human experience, sanctifying it, and raising it on high. The suffering and death of Jesus Christ is the suffering and death of God in the flesh; but His resurrection and ascension reveal His defeat of death on behalf of all humans.

When we ask ourselves, "why go to Church?" we often consider the question in terms of what God can do for us. We think of faith in terms of a transaction: I do this for God, and He gives me this _____ in return. Perhaps we think that coming to

Church will win us a place in Paradise; or maybe we think that God will bless us in this life. Or maybe we simply cherish the spiritual experience we have when we worship. But all of these motives are selfish.

If the death and resurrection of Christ is the evidence of God's love for us, then our response should be coming to Church to show our love in return. We do this when

we praise and worship Him, and when we seek His will. Thus, faith is not a transaction, quid-pro-quo—faith is the way in which we demonstrate our love and trust in God.

May each of you experience the love of God as we praise his Passion and Holy Resurrection.
