Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

Christ is risen! Indeed He is risen!

The resurrection of Jesus Christ is *the* foundational doctrine of the Orthodox Church. Everything rests upon this historical event: that our Lord suffered, died, and arose on the third day. And because we know that he rose, we likewise believe that he has the power to raise us up on the last day. Our hope is based on this truth.

Without the resurrection, our religion does not make sense. As St Paul writes, "If Christ is not risen, then our preaching is empty and your faith is also empty...[and] we are of all men the most pitiable" (1 Cor 15:14,19).

Yet it is one thing to acknowledge the truth of the resurrection, and another to live as though this were true.

To be a Christian is not simply to

listen to Christ's teaching, or affirm that he is the eternal Son of God; rather, it is to be filled with the light of the resurrection. But what does this mean?

On that Pascha of old, Jesus trampled down death by his death, thereby opening to us the doors of Paradise. Henceforth death no longer had power over us. To live according to the resurrection means that we mustn't live in fear of death. In Romans 5:12 we read that death leads to sin (not vice versa - see also Heb 2). In other words, we sin because we live for this life only. When we doubt the resurrection, we focus only on our selfish desires in the hereand-now. But if we know deep within our hearts

that death does not have the last word, and that we will join our Lord in the age to come, then we will live according to his commandments.

In his resurrection, our Lord also trampled upon "the serpent" (Ps 91:13), casting down the devil and his legions from their falsely-acquired authority over us. To live in the resurrection means that we share in his victory. Every time we overcome temptation, the demons are defeated. Every time we repent and confess our sins, the demons are cast

down. We need only to ask our Lord and he will triumph.

In fulfilling God's will we are not on our own. By the gift of the Holy Spirit, the Risen Lord empowers us to act. When we trust him and permit him to work through us, we are transformed by the light of the resurrection. Our lives are of a different kind. For this reason, St John refers to our time here on earth as

the "first resurrection" (Rev 20:5-6).

Now is the period in which we are to "reign with him," having become citizens of his kingdom.

This does not mean we will no longer experience any hardships, but that he will be with us in everything. Christ can lift us up from our suffering and grant us peace and joy in the face of difficulties. For to live a "risen life" is nothing less than to experience the light of Pascha daily.
