Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

The calendar year is punctuated by intervals of calmness and commotion. For many of us, Autumn is one of those times when activity starts to ramp up. Students are back in class, vacations are replaced with projects at work, and the holidays begin to loom in the distance.

When life becomes more hectic, we may be faced with the temptation to rearrange our priorities in order to deal with the stressors.

Our prayer life may begin to suffer, and our attendance at services may drop off. But what we may not realize is that, as we become busier, we need God more than ever to give us the strength and serenity to help us handle these pressures.

Our priorities are like a pyramid: they form a hierarchy based upon what we give our attention to. A Christian

hierarchy places God at the very top, next our family and others entrusted to our care, then other human relationships, then our other responsibilities, and finally our various desires or "wants." Structuring our life in this way prevents us from abandoning that "one thing needful" (Luke 10:42).

But what happens when we alter this order? What happens when we consider our family or friends to be more important than God? Or when we place the success of our career above the spiritual and emotional needs of our family? A hierarchy such as this is like a house built upon sand: "And the rain descended, the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house, and it fell; and great was its fall"

(Matthew 7:27).

Since the beginning of creation, God has been establishing order in his cosmos. He asked Adam and Eve to share in this great responsibility by helping to organize this world. Yet they failed in this vocation. Because they did not have their priorities in the right order, they caused chaos through their disobedience.

In Christ we are once more invited to assist in God's work of ordering the cosmos. But we can

only participate in this work

if our own priorities are put in the right order first. Our thoughts and desires must be directed towards God, which in turn will be shown through our actions: "For every tree is known by its own fruit" (Luke 6:44)

As our daily schedules become more chaotic, it is up to us to push back and work to bring order. The secret is to refuse compromising when

it comes to the most important things in life. By committing ourselves to regular prayer and liturgical attendance; to fasting, tithing, and alms-giving; and to study of the Scriptures—we put God first. And by putting the needs of those who depend on us next in order, we fulfill the second greatest commandment, to love others as we love ourselves. These things are most important in life. There will always be time to deal with everything else.
