Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

Many Orthodox Christians are unaware of what an important figure St Basil the Great was for the early Church. As an hierarch, he helped shore up the administrative gaps in Asia Minor by recruiting anti-Arian bishops for sees. As a theologian, he left us a large body of writings, the most famous of which being his defense of the divinity of the Holy Spirit. He penned the Anaphora for the Liturgy

named after him; and also created a monastic rule for living in community which became the inspiration for St Benedict's famous rule.

One of St Basil's most important endeavors, not often mentioned, is his invention of the public hospital. He expanded on the idea of a soup kitchen that feeds the poor by addressing the need for providing medical

assistance to those who cannot afford doctors. Over several years, he established an institution that would offer food, sleeping quarters, and medical treatment—primarily to lepers, but also to others in need of care. Both physicians and clergy volunteered at this facility which became the blueprint for the modern hospital.

St Basil may be exceptional in regard to his charitable work, but such selflessness is indicative of all the saints. Through their words and actions we are taught the importance of almsgiving, of taking care of those in need, and of pursuing good works in the name of Jesus Christ. It could even be said that an Orthodox Christianity without charity is no Christianity at all.

Today, many of us are jaded when it comes to the thought of charity. We may be quick to retort that the government already takes care of those in need (and thus sound like Scrooge when he quipped, "Are there no prisons...[and] workhouses?"). Or we may be concerned that our resources be used to subsidize vice, such as drunkenness or drug addiction. Yet this can easily become an excuse not to give at all. The question

> for a Christian is not "should I give" but rather "how should I give."

Our parish has been gifted with so much. We have a beautiful temple; and each Sundayweexperience sublime worship and participate in meaningful fellowship. But one aspect we are lacking in, as a community, is charity. Over the years there have been many false starts and

short term efforts; but nothing like a permanent ministry has been established.

While some make New Year's resolutions to lose weight or become more successful, let us take a cue from St. Basil and endeavor to establish more prominent and permanent charitable projects that will address the needs of those in our local neighborhoods, as well as those abroad.
